The Rev. Dr. Barbara C. Crafton, keynote speaker for the conference will preach at Trinity that morning and offer a forum between the services.



Barbara C. Crafton, an Episcopal priest, is author of Jesus Wept: When Faith and Depression Meet, The Sewing Room, and other books. She heads The Geranium Farm, an institute for the promotion of spiritual growth. The Farm publishes her Almost-Daily eMo meditations. She has served a number of churches, including historic Trinity Church, Wall Street, St. John's-in-the-Village in Greenwich Village, and St. Clement's in Manhattan's theatre district. She was a maritime chaplain on the New York waterfront, and served as a chaplain at Ground Zero after the attack on the World Trade Center. Most recently, she served St. James, the American church in Florence, Italy. A spiritual director, Barbara Crafton leads retreats and teaches throughout the United States and abroad.
